Report of 2 September 2025

Meeting commenced 6.30pm

We have also been invited to the Australian Flag Day ceremony to be held at Traralgon Centre Plaza tomorrow morning. All are invited to attend.

Heather mentioned that she had been in Melbourne attending a multi-cultural event on Sunday and that many of the people there had been upset by the anti-immigration demonstration being held in the city.

Secretary's Report: Secretary Glenn reported that our membership is 37 members, but that would be reduced to 36 when the transfer of Endel Vallak to the Rotary Club of Bendigo South was finalized. No Birthdays or anniversaries to report. Norm Butler was inducted into Rotary on 1 September 1979

Spec-tember Project

Simon Trebilcock introduced the Spec-tember Project where members, during September, are asked to collect used spectacles for the **Eyes for Africa** project.

Simon spoke about work being done in Ethiopia where a Rotary Project is



carrying out eye testing and surgery and has a desperate need for used spectacles. This project is being led by **Rotarian Les Brear** of the Rotary Club of Nunawading.

Unlike in our country where spectacles and eye surgery are taken for granted for many years, this is not so for everyone in the world. In Ethiopia **Rotarian Julie Tyers OAM** has been working to get spectacles to support surgery. **Eyes for Africa** has set up a primary Clinic in Ethiopia for this purpose, Optometrists screen local schools to assess children's optical needs, including the need for surgery and for glasses. The team in Ethiopia have people to assess the strength of the donated glasses and to fit new lenses as needed. The Rotary Club of Nunawading have been providing lenses for this purpose.

The **Spectember Project** is to gather as many used spectacles and sunglasses as possible to send to the **Eyes for Africa** team this September. Glasses must be in good condition – lenses not scratched, and frames not broken. It is understood that the magnifier spectacles obtained for chemists are suitable. Donations to assist with transport would be appreciated.

Members were asked to seek out used glasses from friends and relatives and other places that old and unused glasses may be.

Chair Heather thanked Simon for his presentation and presented him with an Adopt a Tree Certificate

Christmas Parade planning continues to go well.

The revised Strategic and Action plan should be out during the coming week. Some of the areas raised in the Club Culture Survey have been incorporated to ensure we act on those concerns.



Spectacular Spectacles



During September 2025, the Rotary Club of Traralgon are collecting spectacles and sunglasses to support an eye care program in Africa. Our "Spec-tember" appeal.



Spectacles and sunglasses are sent to the Meki Eye Clinic, in the Oromia District, Ethiopia, about three hours drive from Addis Ababa. This poor region has over 60,000 people that previously had no access to eye care. Eyes for Africa has restored sight to some 4,000 people living in remote areas of Ethiopia who would otherwise have remained visually impaired. Recently, Eyes for Africa set up a permanent Primary Eye Clinic. It has employed a full time local ophthalmic nurse, and amongst other services, school children are being checked, treated and fitted with "reused" spectacles.

Donated spectacles analysed and prescription noted, and then matched to individual patient's needs. Sunglasses are particularly useful for protection after eye surgery.

Please collect spectacles and sunglasses as follows:

- In good condition - can be worn without the need for any maintenance.

- Hard spectacles cases are useful.

- If spectacles or sunglasses are not in a hard or soft case, please place in a sandwich sized zip-lock bag, with an air pocket to act as cushioning.

- Bi-focal glasses are OK.

- But no to multi-focal spectacles as they are too hard to match to a patient. If the frames are in good condition and the lenses can be removed, please collect just the frames.

- Spectacles and sunglasses are to be brought to the Rotary Club of Traralgon scheduled meetings on Tuesday, 16 September, or Tuesday, 7 October 2025. (6 pm at the Traralgon Golf Club.)

The Rotary Club of Traralgon will then send the glasses to the Eyes for Africa coordinator in Queensland for shipment to Ethiopia.
